The Moot Court Board has partnered with Judge Douglas H. Ginsburg and the Global Antitrust Institute to host the first Global Antitrust Institute Moot Court Competition on February 21, 2015. The competition will be the first antitrust-focused moot court competition.

The competition will feature a problem written by two law students who were supervised by Judge Ginsburg. The competitors will brief one side of the argument and present oral arguments on both sides.

The competition will be held at the courthouse of the US Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit. Eight teams, from American University, the University of Florida, George Washington University, Howard University, the University of Michigan, the University of Notre Dame, and Washington & Lee University, are scheduled to compete.

## **Upper Class Competition Recap**

The 2014 Upper Class Competition (UCC) preliminary and advancing rounds were held at the George Mason University School of Law on November 8, 2014. The semi-final and final rounds were held on November 14th at the Fairfax County Circuit Courthouse.

The competition featured 50 second-year students who competed in teams of two. The students' oral arguments were based on the problem from their LRWA III classes.

Louisa Brooks and Allison Speaker were the Co-Chairs of the competition. They coordinated the event with the executive board, the chief bailiff, and the events, scoring, and judges committees. Impressively, Brooks and Speaker ensured the competition ran on-time throughout the day.

The UCC relies on volunteers from the local legal community to

serve as judges throughout the com-

petition. Stacy Allen and Samantha Rocci Co-Chaired the judges committee and successfully secured three judges for every argument throughout the competition. Overall, 56 judges volunteered
